



Admission requirements for 2026-2027

Faculty of Medicine, Pharmacy and Biomedical Sciences (FMPB)

For reasons of reading ergonomics, this document is not written in inclusive writing. However, it is aimed at both men and women, as well as non-binary people.

In the event of a divergence between the different linguistic versions of these regulations, the French version shall prevail.

Admission for applicants outside the European Union

Before submitting the application, the applicant must carefully read the 2026-2027 admissions regulations and the admission guide available on the page [Register - Student from outside the European Union - University of Mons \(umons.ac.be\)](http://Register - Student from outside the European Union - University of Mons (umons.ac.be))

By submitting the application, the applicant/student **has read the admission guide and undertake to follow the 2026-2027 Admissions Regulations.**

The applicant whose application has been accepted can only be registered if they are present on Belgian territory no later than 30 September. No extension of the validity date of the form will be granted. The "standard form" is valid **until 30 September inclusive** (Art. 9 of the admissions regulations). Any late registration request will be deemed inadmissible.

General Academic requirements for Admission 2026-2027

For all applicants

- No action will be taken on incomplete applications, and late submissions will be rejected.
- The application fee must be paid according to the instructions on the website.
- The authenticity of the documents provided will be verified. Any falsification of the document will result in the cancellation of admission and a procedure for fraud.
- The personalised cover letter required in the application must preferably be typed and written in French (or possibly in English, if the course in question is taught in English).
- The jury also considers the content of the personalised cover letter attached to the admission file. The jury assesses, through the interest expressed by the candidate in the field of study, the chosen pathway or targeted profession, whether the requested training aligns with their professional and personal project, and if it is in harmony with their profile and any previous education.

Admission requirements for 2026-2027

An average of 12/20, or in the absence of a numerical grade, a mention "fairly good" (without prejudice to a more in-depth evaluation of the academic background by the faculty jury), is required for the last year(s) of study taken into account in the evaluation of the application for admission. In the absence of a numerical grade or mention, the file will be sent to the faculty.

Specific academic requirements for admission to the FMPB

Admission to the Master's degree in Biomedical Sciences, with a specialization in neuroscience:

The application cannot be accepted pending the successful completion of the current academic year.

- The average of the results obtained in the original curriculum must be **at least equal to or greater than 12/20** for the last three years of studies that can be used as part of the application for admission.
- The results** obtained during the last three years of study that are relevant to the admission application **must not include any failing grades**.
- The last degree** obtained must be **a Master's degree**, recognized as equivalent or valued for 300 credits by the admission jury.
- An English language certificate, 1 of the 5 following certificates must be submitted**
 - CAMBRIDGE (minimum B2 Common European Framework of Reference)
 - IELTS (minimum B2 Common European Framework of Reference)
 - BULATS (minimum B2 Common European Framework of Reference)
 - TOEIC (a score above 750)
 - TOEFL iBT (minimum B2 Common European Framework of Reference)

certifying a minimum knowledge of a **B2 level in English** of the Common European Framework of Reference or a score greater than 750 on the TOEIC will be attached to the application.

The test results must be sent by e-mail to service.admissions@umons.ac.be, by 15 juin at the latest, specifying in the subject: "Language test results + Reference of the admission file".
